# Discussion points and main findings



- ✓ Integrated production of cachaça, ethanol and livestock products (e.g. meat, milk)
  - Economic and technological conditions for sustainable production of ethanol in microdistilleries
  - Energy self-sufficiency (cooperatives and associations)
  - Energy independence and value adding strategies at the farm level
- ✓ Biofuel production chains assessment
  - Virtual Sugarcane Biorefinery
  - Integrated assessment of agricultural, industrial and transport logistics associated with ethanol production



# Discussion points and main findings



- ✓ Life cycle assessment of bioenergy production systems
  - Important outcomes associated with alternative crops (e.g. sweet sorghum) to increase biorefinery economic efficiency
  - Environmental impacts should not be overlooked,
     particularly regarding to the use of pesticides
- ✓ Sugarcane microdistilleries in Southern Brazil
  - Economic viability is a critical point
  - Integration with other activities (i.e. dairy, sugar, chachaça) seems to be key to the overall sustainability of the project
  - Potential to increase energy self-sufficiency at farm level



## Discussion points and main findings



- ✓ Socioeconomic impact of ethanol production in Mozamabique
  - The impact of sugarcane cultivation (5 million ha) in Mozambique maybe relatively small
  - More knowledge is needed as the regional impact of ethanol biorefineries
- ✓ Potential an location of new ethanol mills in Mozambique
  - Explore potential sugarcane expansion areas in eight provinces
  - Select proper biophysical and socioeconomic indicators to rank regions according to is suitability to produce sugarcane and accommodate sugar mills



#### Way forward



- ✓ Outline a work plan as to the different papers (projects) discussed during the meeting
- ✓ Engage partners, particularly those in Lacaf countries, i.e. Mozambique, Colombia and Guatamala, in the design and development of following activities, which includes:
  - Papers' objectives and research questions: tailor made adjustments to address scientific and regionally relevant research questions
  - Methodology and tools (e.g. models): incorporate and share information as to the use and integration of different models
  - Upcoming field work and visits: strength and expand our current network to reach new experts, hopefully keen to collaborate with Lacaf
